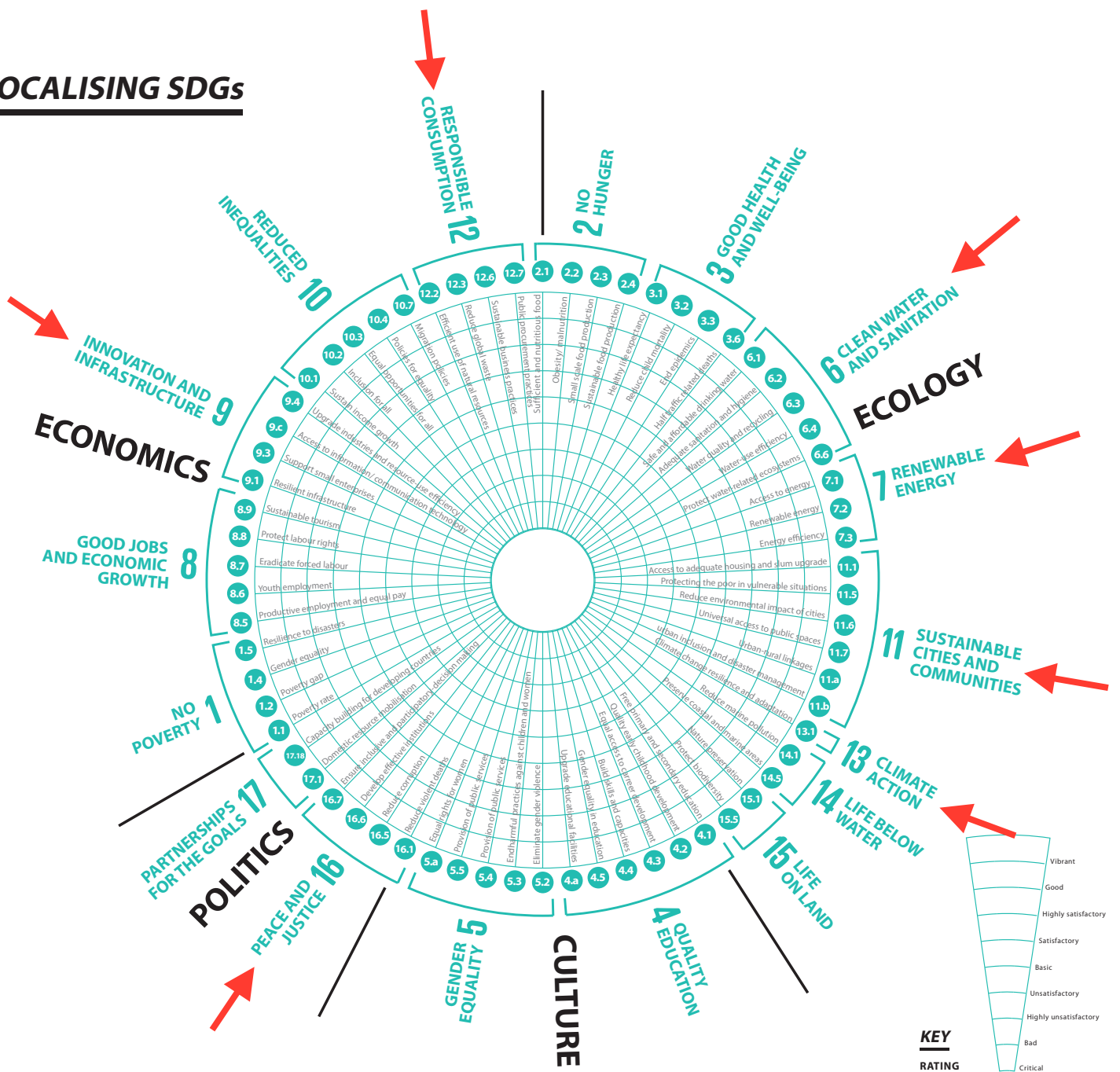


LOCALISING SDGs



Arrangements of SDGs and selection of targets

The circle represents all 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), restructured to follow the four sustainability dimensions defined in the Circle of Life approach. Out of the total of 169 targets of the SDGs, 66 were selected as particularly urban-relevant and maps on this template.

Ranking scale:

The length between the centre of the circle and the perimetre is used to qualify the level of achievement of a particular targets in accordance with the following categories (starting with the most central): critical, bad, highly unsatisfactory, unsatisfactory, basic, satisfactory, highly satisfactory, good, vibrant.
